Report on Application for Naturalization by Enrico TUIA.

Address of Applicant SOUTHAMPTON ROAD, BALINGUP, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

- 1. Have you seen the applicant? Yes. 1A. Has he a permanent address and occupation? Yes.
2. Does his description correspond with that given by him; if not, in what respect is it incorrect? Yes.
2A. Is the applicant of European (white) race or descent? Yes.
3. Are the particulars stated regarding his wife and children correct? Yes.

- 4. Can the applicant read and write the English language? A very little.
5. If not, can he speak it with reasonable fluency and understand it when spoken to on matters of ordinary general interest? Yes.

6. What evidence does applicant produce as to his birthplace and nationality? Italian Passport No. 1112 forwarded herewith.

7. What evidence does applicant adduce as to the period of his residence in Australia or in any other British Dominion? Passport and Form A (No. 42).

8. Do other persons belonging to the nationality he claims recognize him as a fellow countryman? Yes.

9. If resident in Australia during operation of Aliens Registration Act, was he registered as an alien; if so, of what nationality and at what place? Not resident.

10. If not registered, state applicant's explanation.

11. Is the applicant of good character? Yes.

12. Have you seen the persons who have certified to his character, and are they of good repute? Yes.

13. Is he really well known to them? Yes.

14. Have you any record as to his conduct during the war? No.

15. Is there any evidence that the applicant has shown himself by act or speech to be disaffected or disloyal to His Majesty the King? No.

16. What is the state of health of applicant and his wife? Good.

17. What are his reasons for applying for naturalization? Permanent residence and full citizen rights. Owns his own farm.

18. Are you aware of any facts that would make it undesirable that he should be naturalized? No.

19. Has applicant been naturalized or made application for naturalization in Australia previously? No.

20. Has applicant been convicted of any offence? No.

21. Has applicant any intention of leaving the Commonwealth in the near future? If so, when and for what purpose, and how long does he propose to be absent? No.

GENERAL REMARKS— Local School Teacher:— "The applicant seems to be a decent and industrious man and should make a good citizen of the Commonwealth." No adverse record Police Department, or Intelligence Section Department of Defence.
